Dear Chairman Boyd:

The Upper Mississippi River National Wildlife and Fish Refuge has been involved with review of the proposed CapX2020 power transmission project for well over a year. We have and will continue to provide input to Xcel Energy and their contractors since any alternative will have to cross the 240,000-acre, 261-mile-long national wildlife refuge.

However, it has become obvious that there is a tremendous amount of confusion and concern with the general public on this project, especially within communities bordering the refuge.

I strongly support delaying a decision on the certificate of need. The public needs more opportunity and time to learn and understand the true needs and the social and resource tradeoffs of this project. From my experience, giving people additional time now will save time in the long run, especially on a project of this scope.
